The corbel helps to hold up a building roof. Corbel comes from a word, meaning crow's beak. Can you see the resemblance?

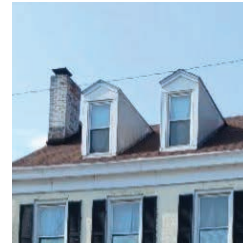

A vertical window that projects from a sloping roof. The name comes from the French word meaning "to sleep."

This building was a bank with many customers who were German immigrants. It has a new purpose as a popular coffee shop.

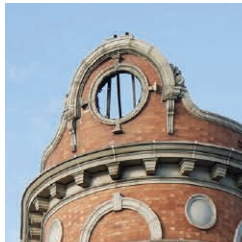

It is made with the colorless gas that lights up when electricity is passed through it.

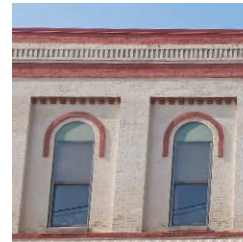
